Flashcards

These revision strategies sometimes work better for some subjects than for others. Flashcards are often used in Languages because they are great for testing yourself on vocabulary. You could use them for testing yourself on key terms in lots of other subjects, too.

Flashcards have something to remember on one side of a card, and the explanation or definition on the other; you can make them using card or paper. It can also be useful to make a presentation with the first slide of a pair being the thing you need to revise, and the next slide being the answer.








FLASHCARDS – WATCH THE VIDEO FOR HOW TO USE THEM

- THESE ARE A VERY GOOD AND SIMPLE SELF TESTING TOOL.
- THEY CAN BE PHYSICAL OR ELECTRONIC.
- QUIZLET'S CARDS ARE GOOD AS THEY PRIORITISE CARDS YOU HAVE PREVIOUSLY GOT WRONG.
- TO MAKE YOUR OWN, TAKE SOME CARD AND CUT INTO RECTANGLES ROUGHLY 10CM X 6CM.
- You then write the keyword on one side and the definition on the other.
- Then go through your cards looking at one side and seeing if you can remember the keyword/definition on the other side.

MIND MAPS


- MIND MAPS ARE NOT SPIDER DIAGRAMS.
- A MIND MAP IS A DIAGRAM USED TO REPRESENT THEMES OF UNDERSTANDING LINKED A CENTRAL KEY WORD OR IDEA.
- MIND MAPS ARE, BY DEFINITION, A
 GRAPHICAL METHOD OF TAKING NOTES.
 THEIR VISUAL BASIS HELPS ONE TO
 DISTINGUISH WORDS OR IDEAS, OFTEN
 WITH COLOURS AND SYMBOLS.
- THEY GENERALLY TAKE A HIERARCHICAL OR TREE BRANCH FORMAT, WITH IDEAS BRANCHING INTO THEIR SUBSECTIONS.




- THE PROCESS STARTS AROUND A CENTRAL IDEA OR PICTURE
- Key themes are established through branches with sub branches

Be concise - Eliminate the unnecessary.

Save space – Replace words with symbols, shorten words or use acronyms to cram in the info.

Stand out – Using diagrams and pictures in place of lengthy explanations makes the information stand out.

Save keywords- When condensing the content remember that keywords are **KEY**.


