
- Make sure you have everything you need to study from home (PAPER/ ACCESS TO COMPUTER FACILITIES/ PRINTER )

# Ask someone to write questions for you

- Write your own challenging questions and then leave it overnight to answer them the next day
- Create mind-maps
- Create flashcards
- Put the key words into new sentences
- Look, cover, write and check
- Mnemonics
- Draw a comic strip of a timeline

- Use the 'clock' template to divide the information into smaller sections. Then test yourself on different sections
- Give yourself spelling tests
- Definition tests
- Draw diagrams of processes
- Draw images and annotate/label them with extra information
- Do further research on the topic
- Create fact files
- Create flowcharts



### MIND MAPS

Mind Mapping is a process that involves a distinct combination of imagery, colour and visual-spatial arrangement.

The technique maps out your thoughts using keywords that trigger associations in the brain to spark further ideas.


Once you have made your map, cover it and test yourself on different strands, eg. How much of the blue strand can you recall



## SPIDER DIAGRAMS





## CLOCK LEARNING

Be concise - Eliminate the unnecessary.


