Born:


1860s

Known for:

Known for:

Invented an accurate model of the Earth which led to the development of the Global Positioning System (GPS). She was the second black woman to be employed by the Naval Surface Warfare Centre Division.


Edward Bouchet

Known for:

The first female African- American neurosurgeon in the United States. Also the first to be certified by the Board of Neurological Surgery. She specialised in children's surgery.


Walter lincoln hawkins

Known for:

First African-American woman to receive a Ph.D in chemistry in the United States. With other scientists she helped to develop how food and diet can affect the health of the heart and circulatory system.


Percy Julian
