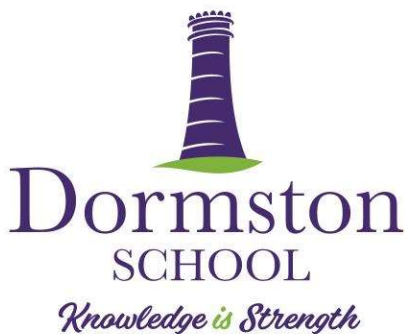

**Re: Diversity in Dormston**

We would like to update you on the 'Diversity in Dormston' programme that has been running at Dormston School for over a year now. Here at Dormston, we strive to make all students feel welcome and secure, free to be the people they want to be. We actively promote inclusion and seek to address any issues that students may face in their time with us. We participate in events such as Black History Month to promote multiculturalism and have gained the Stonewall Award for our work on promoting the rights of the LGBTQ+ community.

On our school website, you can find more details <https://dormston.dudley.sch.uk/diversity-in-dormston/> you can discover some of the work that we do to promote diversity and you can view resources we show students, view where our curriculum covers these areas, see reading lists, view staff training on this and access websites that can offer further information. We want our students to fully engage with British Values and the factors of 'Mutual Tolerance and Respect' and 'Individual Liberty' which at the core of our diversity work. We expect all students to be fully respectful of all people, regardless of gender, sexuality, race, ethnicity, ability, language, country of origin or religion. If students are not respectful of these characteristics, we take action to provide them with education to learn from their mistakes and repair the harm caused. For example, any pupil who is at fault in a racist incident, will be required to take part in a bespoke workshop to tackle the misconceptions and ideas that they may have. This is based on the 'Kick it Out' course and we do the same for homophobia.

Within school we promote Diversity in Dormston through:

1. Assemblies - the Equality Act and Black History Month, LGBTQ+ month, Neuro Diversity Week. These include information on the different types of discrimination, not just direct, but also harassment and micro-aggressions that will not be tolerated.
2. Weekly Power Points - reminders of days such as 'International Day against Racism', 'International Day against Homophobia/Transphobia/Bi-phobia/National Deaf Awareness Week, Ramadan etc. These often include video links and discussion points.
3. PSHE - multiculturalism in Year 9 and Stone Wall, identities and multiculturalism in Year 10.

6. 'Where in the World?' map - students are asked to say where their families are from around the world, we label this and place this on a display to show how far around the world our school reaches.
7. 'Diversity' email - students and parents/carers can report any incidents of racism, homophobia, transphobia, sexism, religious discrimination, disability discrimination or any other form of discrimination to a bespoke email address, which is monitored and issues are dealt with.
8. 'Be Heard' box - students can anonymously place concerns in a box where incidents will be picked up and monitored.
9. LGBTQ+ club - ran by students to discuss issues and provide support.
10. Student and staff surveys on experiences of racism in Dormston- this will be repeated this year to see what progress has been made.



11. Display in the atrium on Diversity in Dormston.
12. Posters displayed for 'Step Up Beat Hate'- contact details for a local team, working with the police to report and discuss hate crime.
13. LGBTQ+ noticeboard, created by students on display.
14. Bespoke workshops for any pupils who have made a racist or homo/ trans/bi phobic comments or gesture, using the 'Kick it Out' campaign materials.
15. Positive representations of people from diverse backgrounds e.g. Maths/ Science corridors.

### Updates 2022/2023

1. We have analysed the results of the student survey issued to students of non-white British backgrounds (this includes students of dual heritage) and found that the amount of students who have faced direct racism had fallen 43% in the past 12 months. This is very pleasing, although we still have a way to go. We also are pleased that 89% of students had heard of the 'Diversity in Dormston' programme which is a huge improvement on the previous year. On the week beginning 3rd October, Black History Month assemblies were held, where students were invited to celebrate the input and impact of black people into society and to reveal the results of the survey. Students were also reminded to use the 'diversity' email address or come and see us if they are concerned about any discrimination issues.
2. During October, to celebrate Black History Month, all curriculum areas are sharing and celebrating role models from their areas from black backgrounds.
3. Further staff training was held on 3rd October to ensure all staff are aware of the programme and what to do if a discrimination incident happens in their class or a student reports it to them. Please be aware that staff will always try to reassure the students that the matter will be investigated. All incidents are recorded and dealt with according to our policy.
4. We aim to begin network planning with other schools in the Dudley area to improve our provision on diversity.
