



# THIS IS WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE DON'T CELEBRATE DIVERSITY



Wage gap- black people at university graduate level are paid on average 18% less than white people

Black women are 5x more likely to die in maternity services than white women

Black people are 9x more likely to be stopped and searched by the police

Racially motivated Hate Crimes are the highest reported type of Hate Crime in the UK. A total of 109,843 racially aggravated offences were recorded in 2021/2022 – an increase by 19%

Over 1/3 of people from minority ethnic groups have been assaulted (University of Manchester)

Between 40-50% of people from Black Caribbean, Any other Black, and White and Black Caribbean groups reported facing racist abuse while out shopping, in parks, cafes or restaurants or on public transport. (King's College, London)

Black people are more likely to receive a **harsher police response- 5x more** likely to be charged than cautioned or warned.

UK **poverty rate is twice as high** for Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) groups as for white groups. (JRF).

Race Equality Foundation shows that Bangladeshi households are 63 per cent and **Black African households 75** per cent more likely than white British households to suffer 'housing deprivation' eg. insufficient heating.


Homelessness- In Wolverhampton, for example, in 2011, 26 per cent of the population were from a BAME community, but these same communities made up about 40 per cent of the homeless cases seen by the local authority.

## perception

- Micro aggressions are small subtly aggressive things about the way a person acts , looks or comes across as.
- Identified by how they make the person it's received by feel, as well as what the comment was made based on.



# They are usually to do with...

#### Physical aspects such as:


- Stereotypes
- Personality
- Hair
- Smell
- Accent

And often present themselves as comments like

- "You're really well educated for someone of your kind!"
- "All lives matter"
- "You're like an Oreo, black on the inside and black on the outside."







## How to avoid them


- Think about what your comment is implying.
- Ask before you touch peoples' things.
- Consider if your compliment could be seen as back-handed
- Take the time to educate yourself on black history and how we came to be as a people.

## WHY IT MATTERS

- UK census 2021-82% of people identified with a White ethnic group, 74% White British, 9% with an Asian ethnic group, 4% with a Black ethnic group, 3% with Mixed or Multiple ethnic groups, and 2% with other ethnic groups.
- 50% of Dudley College students are non- white British
- Dudley= 82.4% White British
- Wolverhampton = 54.7% White British

Wolverhampton was the local authority with the largest proportion of Puniahi

speaking residents (6.5%).

It is important we highlight the history that has been ignored, and we continue to celebrate the achievements of the Black community today.


#### What does the Black Lives Matter movement stand for?

Racism


Suggests you have some things others do not. Acknowledges that people experience life differently because of their background i.e. race, gender, class, economic circumstances

When the police use too much force and violence against people without a good reason.


Institutional/systematic racism

In this context, a person who supports a cause, even if it doesn't affect them directly e.g. a White person who supports Black Lives Matter.



#### **Alexander Dumas**

A French writer best known for The Count of Monte Cristo and The Three Musketeers.

Dumas' father was Black Haitian and became a brigadier general in the French army.

So why was white actor Gérard Depardieu chosen to depict Black author Alexandre Dumas in a film about his life?



Known by her stage name Baby Esther, **Esther Jones** was an American singer and entertainer. She often sang popular songs in a higher-pitched, babied voice and used the phrase 'boop-boop-a-doop'.

A studio appropriated her Baby Esther persona to create the white Betty Boop cartoon character. What do you think about Baby Esther's image being used to create Betty Boop?



Big Mama Thornton was the first to record the song Hound Dog in 1952. Although she didn't write the song, it was written for her and was inspired by her.

So, why do we all attribute Hound Dog to Elvis, who recorded the song four years after Big Mama Thornton?

Katherine Johnson's calculations ensured the first American astronauts able to orbit the Earth and return safely, and that the Apollo 11 flight successfully landed on the Moon.

She was also involved with the Apollo 13 mission, and the plans for the Mars mission.

So why is there no mention of Katherine on any of those project's Wikipedia pages?




396<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment

An American army regiment that were assigned to the French army during WWI, as many racist, white American soldiers refused to work with them. Their unit was deployed to the trenches for over six months, the longest deployment of any unit. Over 100 men from 369th were awarded by France and/or America. One was Henry Johnson, the first American ever to receive the Croix de Guerre medal, awarded for valour.


