With regards uniform, attached is an up to date uniform poster, I need to stress the expectation regarding school skirts. Skirts must be of an appropriate length and material.








This term too many skirts have been too short and not of the correct material. School uniform is designed for functionality and not fashion and consequently will be challenged in September.
