


## **ALL YEAR 7 PARENTS/CARERS**

## **Attendance and Punctuality:**

As you are aware Attendance to school is very important and embedding good habits in Year 7 is essential. This will ensure pupils have the best support network in place for when they reach Year 11 and need to prepare for their GCSE's. In my last assembly I discussed this with pupils and the importance of being punctual and attending school. Our goal is for every student to aim for 100% attendance and to maintain a minimum of 97% by the end of Summer term. While occasional absences, due to illness, are understandable, minor ailments (such as a cough, cold, or sore throat) should not prevent students from attending school. Please encourage your child/ren to be resilient and attend school whenever possible, even if they are experiencing minor disruptions.

May I also remind you that your child must be on time for school and in form for 8.40am prompt. Ideally onsite from around 8:30am. If there is a reason they may be late, please email me on <a href="mailto:scooksey@dormston.dudley.sch.uk">scooksey@dormston.dudley.sch.uk</a><br/>
Due to the government's increased priority on punctuality, detentions will be in place if your child does not arrive until after 9.00am. If they do not attend until after 9.30am, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence for the morning session. We have to comply with government standards and implement these school changes. As a school we strongly support the notion that punctuality and attendance is vital to your child's success.
